When he does run late with his appointments (and this happens with caring professionals who accept that some patients need a little more time than anticipated) he is always apologetic in a way which although totally unnecessary, is very much appreciated. In theatre, he sensitively goes through the hoped for outcome with the patient in a calm but factual manner. One thing Professor Warwick will never do is make false promises. With Dupuytren's patients, he will never say he can make a finger perfectly straight, when he knows this is not possible. I have spoken with others of his patients and this is the one thing we all liked. It gives a patient confidence in knowing a surgeon accepts his limitations in a humble manner rather making false promises. After surgery, he repeatedly checked on my condition, both personally and via his staff who monitor patients regularly. He asked if I had any concerns and spoke about anything not previously covered which had occurred during treatment. Even after discharge, Professor Warwick never ceases to disadvantage himself for others. He instructs patients to come straight back to the hospital if they have any worries and he means just that. On one occasion, when off-duty, he left his family and his Christmas shopping just to check and re-dress my finger, many a surgeon would have just instructed someone in outpatients to take a look. His support staff, from receptionists to nurses, anaesthetists to physios, and, of course, matron, are warm and welcoming. I have noticed how Professor Warwick treats them all with respect and is so appreciative of their help. I even witnessed this when a member of the catering staff brought him some sandwiches and a glass of orange juice one lunch-hour. Seen quickly, options for wrist break recovery were explained sympathetically. Operation to insert titanium plate carried out on 12 Dec (a bad fall happened in Sweden on 3 Dec) and with no complications I was discharged on the same day as the op. Uncomfortable dressing due to superficial bleeding post op was removed gently and another placed after a week, then stitches removed on 24 Dec. A protective customised splint helped recovery for a month and only two physio sessions were required, as I worked on my exercises on my own. 3 months later with a scar almost invisible, the strength in my hand has returned to almost where it was before the accident. I was impressed with Prof. Warwick's skills as a surgeon. His no-nonsense, energetic and encouraging attitude towards the wrist break together with his undoubted skill as a hand surgeon gave me the courage to get through the ordeal of a wrist breakage and a first time operation under general anaesthetic.
